Environmental Protection: One Thrust area distinctive to institutional vision and mission

The College envisions Environmental Protection as an area of utmost importance as it incorporates the great values of Environmental Awareness, concern for protection of wildlife including all flora and fauna, drives for controlling pollution and balancing natural equilibrium, rescuing and treating injured wild animals, taking action for protecting animals on the point of extinct. Some select activities are:

Activities concerning Environmental Awareness and concern for protection of wildlife including all flora and fauna:

i. Celebration of Wildlife Week from 1st to 7th October, 2018 involving 600 villagers, 1 teacher, 1 staff and 10 students to aware the villagers on the need to protect wildlife,

ii. Special Camp at Saraipung Forest Village from 26th to 31st December, 2018, involving 25 students, 2 teachers 1 staff to aware them on cleanliness and importance of protecting flora and fauna.

iii. Mural Painting to generate environment Awareness from 1st to 5th June, 2019 with participation of 200 students, 1 teacher 1 staff.

Drives for controlling pollution and balancing natural equilibrium:

i. Celebration of Van Mahotsav from 1st to 7th July, 2018 at Bogapani Elephant Corridor by planting 200 saplings in the degraded region of the corridor

ii. Conducting Campaign against Open Defecation from 1st to 31st July, 2018 covering 4, 500 villagers in 18 different village with involvement of 59 students, 1 teacher and 1 staff.

iii. Trash Tag Challenge Initiatives to clean 5 village from 27th April, 2019 to 3rd May, 2019

Rescuing and treating injured wild animals and taking up of action for protecting animals on the point of extinct: Snake Rescuing:

Department of Zoology, under the leadership of Mr. Rajib Rudra Tariang is involved in rescuing and treating injured wild animals and protecting animals on the point extinct. He has been especially involved in rescuing snake since 2008 during which he has rescued snakes of 50 different species from human habitat more than 1000 times. During rescue of such snakes, the interested students have been educated and involved. Moreover, forest personnel are also involved in the **Snake Rescue Techniques** and **the Rescue Protocols**. The Zoology Department also undertook several awareness drives in villages, schools, colleges, institutions, Fire service personnel, Forest Department and trained participant to identify snakes, focussed on the importance of snakes in the society, elaborated the first-aid-measures in snake bite. In collaboration with Aranyak and Forest Department, Digboi College has produced and distributed coloured posters and leaflets in both local language and English to aware the public to protect snakes.
